WONCA Research Working Party Multi-national Plenary Panel Project

Introduction

This project is designed to address a knowledge gap in terms of how primary care is organised around the world, and to create dialogue between colleagues and colleges about how the fundamental values of primary care can be addressed and preserved within the constraints of different healthcare systems, sometimes operating within the same country. This is a low-cost project to be undertaken in different WONCA regions by capitalising on the existing opportunity that WONCA regional meetings represent for dialogue and scientific communication by leading primary care clinicians and researcher.

There are seven regions: Europe, Asia/Pacific, Africa, America, Iberoamericana- CIMF, South Asia and Eastern Mediterranean (EMRO) and many of these hold a regional meeting annually so we may rapidly build up a repository from many nations. Designated members of the Working Party (WP) Executive take responsibility for organising the panels for their region.

The project is supported and endorsed by WONCA and by the International Committee of the North American Primary Care Research Group (NAPCRG).

WP Regional Coordinators for the project

Format

At each regional meeting, one of the plenary sessions will be a panel discussion where representatives from up to six countries discuss the facilitators and barriers that the organisation of the healthcare system in their nation impacts on providing effective primary care.

The suggested format is a 90-minute panel with a 10-minute presentation from each country and a 30-minutes facilitated discussion.

The panel material will be summarised for a preparation of a monograph or paper for publication in a peer-reviewed journal. The monograph will be posted on the WONCA and regional web sites following the meeting, and papers prepared for publication in academic journals.

At each WONCA World meeting Regional leaders or their delegates will run a similar plenary panel summarising the findings from their region. This will enable regional meeting findings to receive a global audience and improve knowledge- sharing across regions.

This will provide a useful resource, allowing us to compare PHC systems throughout the world and to further our understanding when one of our colleagues from another nation talks about PHC, family medicine or general practice. It can help build up a picture of what works well and what does not.

From 2017 the panels will focus on the role of primary health care teams.

Role of WP regional coordinators

- Identify and liaise with convenor of regional conference.
- Ensure the panel is included in the programme, preferably as a plenary session
- Find out who is already presenting from countries in that region
- Select and contact suitable panellists, invite them to participate. We strongly suggest that panellist from each country have some familiarity with research and information management, and be willing to commit to following the presentation guidelines and contribute to the monograph.
- Provide panellists with templates for collating information, preparing powerpoint slides, writing monographs and papers for publication
- Review the prepared monographs and powerpoint slides prior to the event for each panellist and provide feedback if necessary
- Act as Chair or arrange for a delegate Chair for the panel. The Chair must ensure that each member keeps to the brief and does not go over time.

Project co-ordination

Overall co-ordination will be undertaken by Chris van Weel and Felicity Goodyear-Smith, who will assist with the provision of templates, provide overall guidance and support to the WP Regional Coordinators, undertake the dissemination of prepared monographs onto the WONCA website, and co-ordinate the report back to the WP on Research annually.
